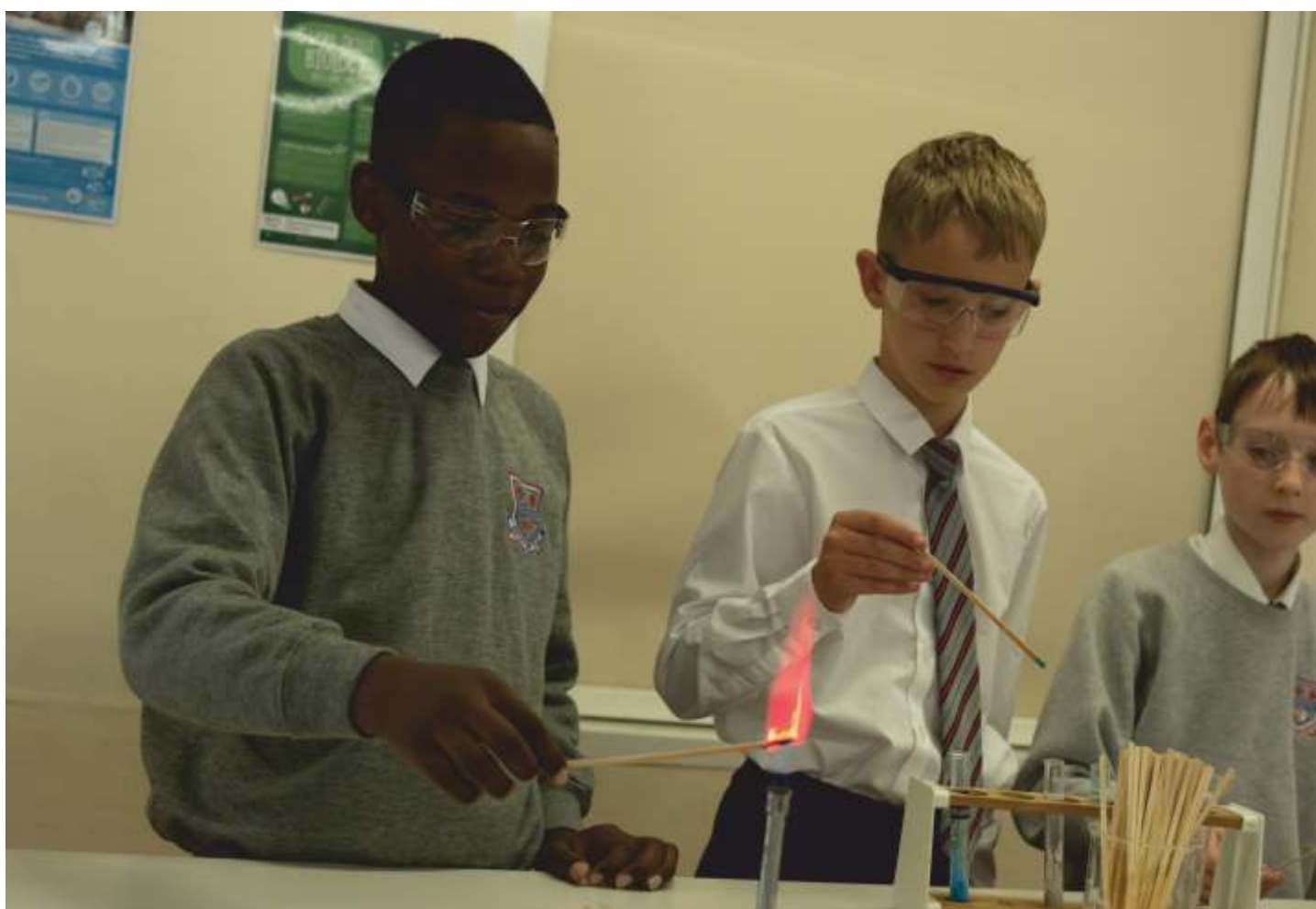

We pride ourselves on being a school which truly serves and listens to our community and are fortunate to be able to teach the children of children whom some of us taught! Understanding young people and the pressures the twenty-first century world creates are key to providing our students with the best education and support we can. As a community school we work very closely with outside agencies to support learning and to be an active part of life in Bottesford and Ashby.

Support for learning is crucial and we believe very strongly that working together is the best way to support young people's learning. By appointment, in order to make sure the appropriate person is available, parents are always welcome in school and all parents receive termly assessment data in order to monitor young people's progress. Parents will also be invited to both annual Parents' Evenings and wonderful Celebration Assemblies, which give recognition to pupils' achievements.

"PREP" work is an online homework system designed to promote independence and organisation skills, as well as promote revision and the concept of working outside the classroom.

All students have a form tutor who, it is intended, will remain with them for their full five years at Frederick Gough. This tutor group becomes the "school family" and they are also members of the year group and larger traditional House group.

Each year group has a Learning Co-ordinator, an Assistant Learning Co-ordinator and a Pupil Equity Advocate as well as a linked member of the Senior Leadership Team. It is important to us to know our pupils on an individual basis and to be proactive in supporting their learning. We have a strong belief in positive behaviour and our rewards system is designed to praise all students in school.

We believe passionately in supporting students' emotional wellbeing; Every Child Matters in practice and in principle.

Rosenshine principles, Personalised Learning Checklists and diagnostic assessments are used in all of our lessons and we believe they are some of the most important factors in our success. It means that the young people know "where they are – where they need to go – and how to arrive there". This, coupled with regular termly assessments sent home and individualised academic targets, ensure that parents, children and school all work closely together to ensure success.
